


AFTERMATH OF DIVINE TALE

This is being held in Prayagraj, Uttar Pradesh at Triveni Sangam. What is Triveni Sangam? It is a confluence of three rivers named as Bhagirathi, Alaknanda (collectively known as Ganga) and Yamuna, which is said to be a holy union of divine rivers. This mela is said to be once in 144 years event. To be precise, there are various types of Kumbha mela that occur based on their time interval , Purna Kumbha mela once in $12~{\rm years}$, Ardha Kumbha mela once in 6years and Maha Kumbha Mela once in 144 years. There are four sacred places on the soil of India wherein, these happen.

HEAVENLY ROOTS OF IT



Legend has it that during the tumultuous battle for the possession of Amrita, drops of this divine elixir fell at four sacred locations on Earth: Prayag (modern-day Allahabad), Haridwar, Ujjain, and Nasik. 
The Grand Finale of Our Journey!

Sankranti is the same: joy, gratitude, and the promise of a fresh start. It's not just a festival: it's a reminder that even after the longest winter, the sun always returns.




Where Milk Boils Over with Joy!



Social heroes NSS's Police station visit




