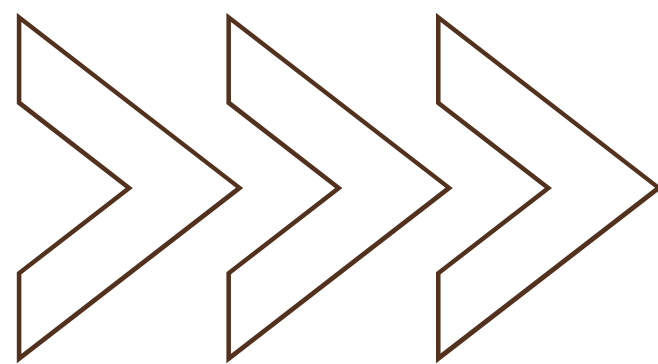

LEGACY OF KNOWLEDGE

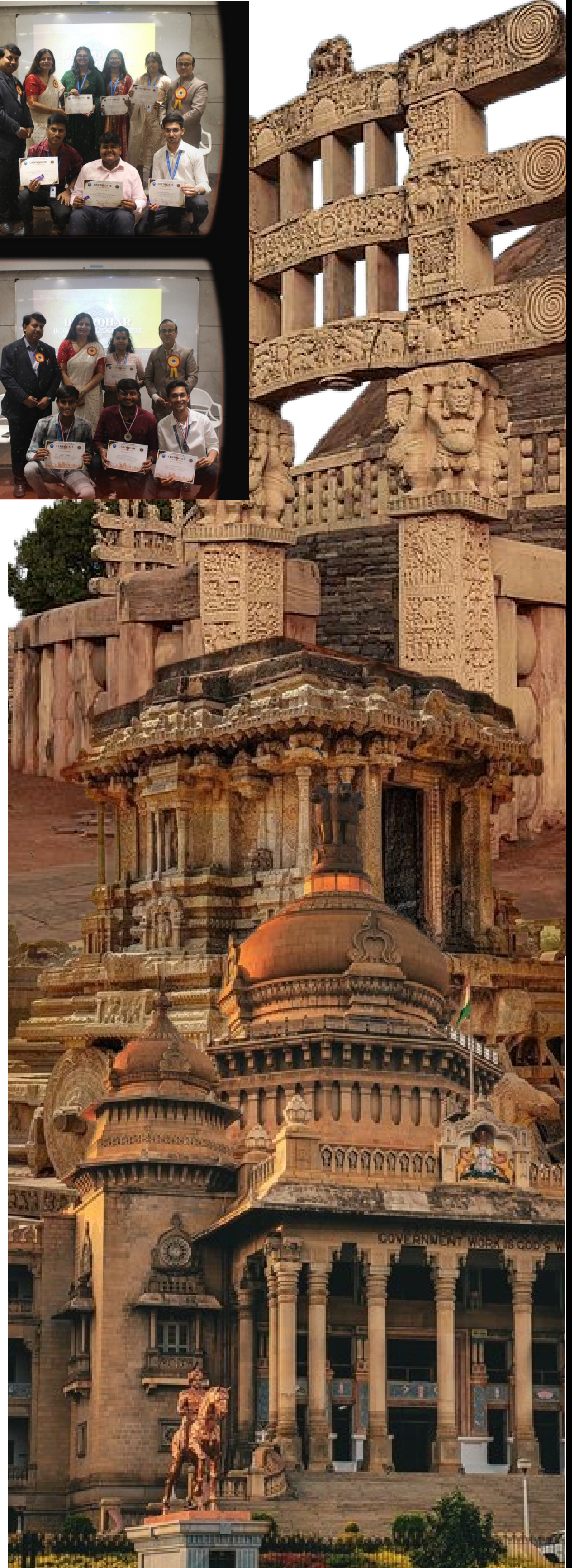

STUDENT OPINION ON THIS BUDGET



India's Union Budgets of 2024 and 2025, while both geared towards national development, showcase distinct approaches and priorities. The 2024 budget focused on fiscal consolidation, balancing growth with prudent financial management. While supporting agriculture through infrastructure development and technology adoption, it also addressed rural development through infrastructure projects and livelihood generation. Income tax changes were introduced, but the emphasis remained on simplification. Infrastructure spending continued its upward trend, and support for MSMEs was provided through credit guarantee schemes. In contrast, the 2025 budget, while still mindful of fiscal responsibility, prioritizes growth through significantly increased capital expenditure, particularly in infrastructure projects like new regional airports and expanded interest-free loans to states. This shift reflects a stronger focus on stimulating economic activity and achieving a "Viksit Bharat" (Developed India).

A key differentiator lies in the approach to income tax. The 2025 budget features a more comprehensive overhaul of the income tax regime, with revised slabs and enhanced benefits, potentially making the new regime more appealing to taxpayers. Agriculture receives a renewed push, focusing on enhancing productivity, diversification, and post-harvest management, with specific missions for oilseeds and cotton. Rural development is elevated through a comprehensive "Rural Prosperity and Resilience" program emphasizing skilling and diversification of the rural economy. Support for MSMEs is further strengthened with increased credit guarantee coverage and other targeted initiatives. These changes signal a move towards more transformative reforms across various sectors.

Beyond these specifics, the 2025 budget is more explicitly aligned with the "Viksit Bharat" vision, with clearly defined targets and initiatives. The emphasis on four key pillars – the poor, youth, farmers, and women – underscores the commitment to inclusive development. The budget also aims for more significant reforms in sectors like taxation, power, urban development, and mining. While the 2024 budget laid a foundation for continued growth, the 2025 budget takes

a more proactive stance, aiming to accelerate development and propel India towards its vision of a developed nation through strategic investments and targeted reforms.

India's Union Budget 2025 charts a course towards a "Viksit Bharat" (Developed India), emphasizing growth and inclusive development through transformative reforms. The budget rests on four key pillars: empowering the poor (Garib), nurturing youth, strengthening farmers (Annadata), and uplifting women (Nari). Significant focus is placed on income tax reforms, featuring a revamped tax regime with lower slabs and increased benefits for senior citizens, potentially eliminating income tax for many salaried individuals. Agriculture receives substantial support through enhanced productivity measures, diversification initiatives, and improved post-harvest infrastructure. Rural development is prioritized via a comprehensive "Rural Prosperity and Resilience" program focusing on skilling and economic growth. Infrastructure spending sees a major boost, including interest-free loans to states and plans for new airports. MSMEs benefit from increased credit guarantee coverage, while the education sector anticipates Atal Tinkering Labs, broadband in schools, and IIT expansion. Healthcare provisions include daycare cancer centers and adjustments to life-saving drug duties. The financial sector witnesses increased FDI limits in insurance and a new Grameen credit score framework.

Beyond these highlights, the budget addresses numerous crucial areas. Women's development is supported through term loans for entrepreneurs, while nutritional support is extended to children and mothers. Ambitious missions target manufacturing, clean technology, and nuclear energy. Flagship programs like the Jal Jeevan Mission are extended, and a Center of Excellence in AI is established. The budget reflects a comprehensive approach, aiming to stimulate economic activity, improve living standards, and propel India towards its vision of a developed nation. While this summary captures the essence of the budget, consulting official documents is crucial for a complete and accurate understanding of the detailed provisions and their potential impact.

STOCK MARKET CRASH:

A Temporary Storm or a Sign of Caution?"

The stock market is the backbone of any economy, allowing businesses to grow and investors to build wealth. However, it is also highly volatile, experiencing frequent ups and downs. Recently, the Indian stock market faced a major downturn, with the Sensex plunging 2,300 points in just five days and the Nifty 50 briefly dipping below 23,000 before stabilizing. Investors lost nearly ₹18 lakh crore, making it a tough week for the market.

Why Did the Market Fall?

Aggressive FPI Selling:-

Foreign Portfolio Investors (FPIs) have been withdrawing funds from India due to rising US bond yields, making American assets more attractive. A strong dollar and the US Federal Reserve's cautious stance on interest rate cuts further contributed to capital outflows.

Global Trade War Concerns:-

US President Donald Trump's 25% tariff on steel and aluminum has increased fears of a global trade war. This could hurt Indian exports, disrupt supply chains, and weaken the rupee. Potential retaliatory tariffs from the EU add to market uncertainty.

Weak Q3 Earnings:-

Many companies, especially in the consumer staples, auto, and building materials sectors, reported lower-than-expected earnings, shaking investor confidence.

Overvaluation Fears:-

The Buffett Indicator shows India's market capitalization-to-GDP ratio at 114.46%, signaling overvaluation. Experts like S. Naren and Aswath Damodaran have warned about inflated stock prices, especially in mid and small-cap stocks.

While the fall has caused fear, history proves that markets recover. Smart investors see downturns as opportunities. Instead of panicking, staying calm and investing wisely will lead to long-term gains. The market will bounce back—patience is key!

The Maha Kumbh Mela, a monumental Hindu festival, is set to take place in Prayagraj, Uttar Pradesh, from January 13 to February 26, 2025. Recognized as the world's largest human gathering, this event is expected to draw approximately 660 millions devotees, pilgrims, and tourists from around the globe.

The festival holds profound spiritual significance, commemorating the mythical event where the god Vishnu obtained a golden pot containing the nectar of immortality from the demons. Devotees believe that bathing at the confluence of the Ganges, Yamuna, and the mythical Saraswati rivers during the Maha Kumbh purifies the soul and liberates one from the cycle of birth and death.

In anticipation of the massive influx of visitors, the Uttar Pradesh government has initiated extensive preparations. A sprawling temporary city, covering over 40 square kilometers, is under construction along the riverbanks. This area will feature housing, roads, electricity, water facilities, communication towers, and 11 hospitals. Approximately 20,000 workers are dedicated to maintaining cleanliness, including managing over 150,000 temporary toilets.

To ensure the safety and security of attendees, a multi-layered plan is in place. About 50,000 security personnel are being trained to manage the vast crowds effectively. Advanced surveillance systems, including over 2,500 cameras—some powered by artificial intelligence—will monitor crowd movements and densities in real-time, aiding in the prevention of potential stampedes.

Environmental sustainability is a key focus for Maha Kumbh 2025. The festival grounds are being designated as plastic-free zones, with biodegradable alternatives promoted. A robust waste management system is being established to ensure cleanliness, and solar-powered lighting and water heaters are being installed to minimize environmental impact.

The aha Kumbh Mela 2025 promises to be a monumental celebration of faith, culture, and community. With meticulous preparations by the Indian government and local authorities, it aims to provide a safe, inclusive, and spiritually uplifting experience for millions of devotees, reaffirming India's rich cultural heritage on a global stage.

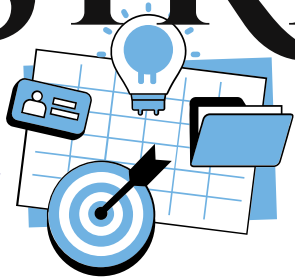
business idea of an intercollegiate participant and “Matrubhumi” were given special mention.

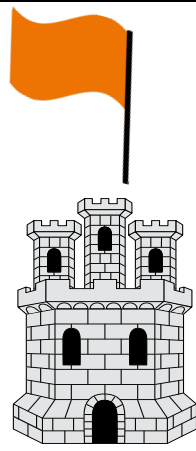

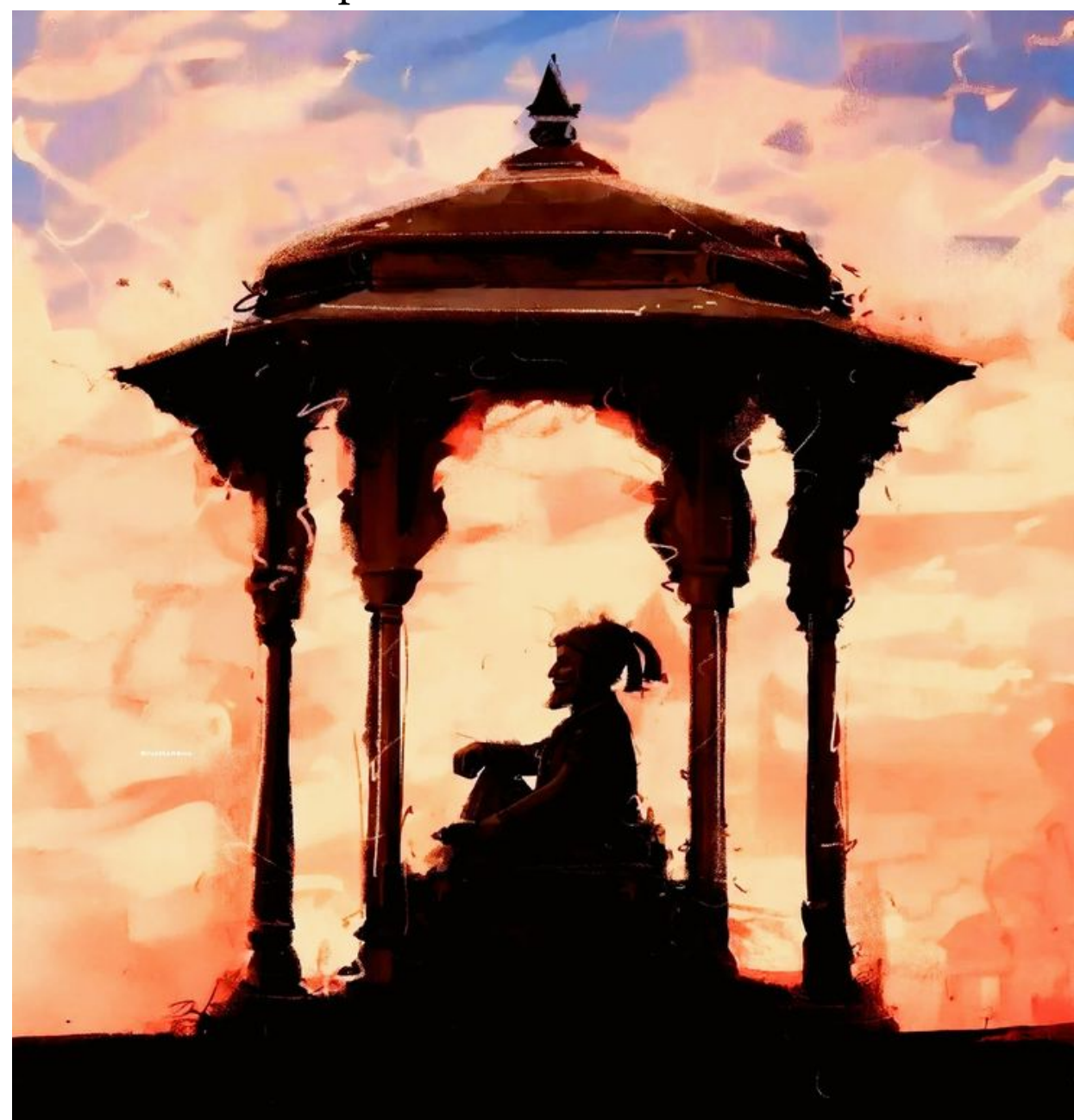
A Grand Tribute to
