The program not only focuses on improving aptitude, reasoning, and technical knowledge but also emphasizes the development of essential soft skills, communication, and interview strategies. Through workshops, mock interviews, group discussions, and personalized guidance, students gain practical insights into industry standards and expectations.

By providing this structured support, the college aims to bridge the gap between classroom learning and professional requirements, boosting student confidence and readiness for campus placements. The Practice:

Duration & Frequency: Training sessions are conducted every year for 2–3 weeks before the placement season.

Modules Covered:

Soft Skills & Communication: Group discussions, personal interviews, presentation skills.

Resume Writing & Career Guidance: Professional resume preparation, LinkedIn profile guidance.



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Mock Interviews & Feedback: Simulated interviews and real-time feedback to improve performance.

Resource Persons: Experienced faculty members, industry experts, and placement consultants.

Participation: Students from all streams are encouraged to participate, with sessions tailored to different career domains.
